Greetings from the Literature Distribution Committee. For those of you who submitted your order via email, a special thanks. A general thank you to those who placed orders in advance via the answering machine (954-797-9257). And finally, thank you all for your patience and cooperation. This month I had no help at all filling orders prior to our Area meeting. This is too big a job for one person and if we cannot fill the Vice Chair position we may have to discontinue advance ordering. This would mean we could only fill orders at Area on a first-come, first-serve basis. That translates into longer wait times for GSR's trying to purchase literature, and a chaotic atmosphere, so please find someone to fill the Vice Chair position. The Vice Chair would need to be available the weekend of Area (Saturday mornings from 10-2 and Sunday from noon until close of Area meeting) to help fill orders and to learn how literature is inventoried and ordered. Some general housekeeping: if you have a large order please try and bring the largest denomination of bills possible - \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100 are greatly appreciated. It speeds the wait time for those in line behind you and also for our treasurer. Most convenience stores are happy to exchange your single dollars for their larger denomination bills. Just a suggestion if you can. When ordering by phone remember to start with your group name, your name, phone number and then please have an order form filled out and READ FROM THE ORDER FORM, starting with books and doing down side one and then down side two. This is beneficial for both of us as it saves time and eliminates confusion. No need to read the whole IP name, just say, for example, IP #1, 5 copies and so on. Remember that specialty medallions must be pre-ordered and paid for in advance. Here are instructions for placing your order online:

## Newsletter: Jeff M. 954-572-6116

I'm Jeffrey, and I'm an addict. Getting the first issue of this volume of The Bottom Line has been a certain growing experience. A lot has gone on. Logistically, I should like to give you some information as to why it took three months to get this issue out. First, getting enough articles to fill the issue was quite a task. By the time of the November area, I had enough pieces to fill the newsletter to 8 pages. Unfortunately, my budget got defeated, and I had to go back to the drawing board to cut the number of articles. After I got that done, I sent the document to the printer. Next was the issue that turned up with the printer I decided on. Copan's Quick Printing -CQP- (unaffiliated) is the printer that produces the meeting list for the area. I thought to offer them the opportunity to print the Newsletter based on their regular quality meeting lists they produce. I got five bids from various printers, and I gave CQP the opportunity to beat the best bid. They did, and I made a commitment to them for the job. They turned out to be more unreliable than I had expected. My contact at CQP contacted me two weeks ago to let me know he needed some fonts from me in order to get it printed, and he told me he would e-mail me the names of the fonts he needed on the next morning. He never did. I tried to contact him daily until just three days ago, when I finally reached him. Initially, he proceeded to try to tell me he sent the e-mail concerning the fonts, then he backed up and admitted that he sent them "this morning" - Friday. I told him I would consider using him for the next issue, but that I had to find a printer that could have it for me this weekend. I ended up having to go with Office Depot for the printing of this issue. I am only somewhat happy with the result. It is a fine publication because of the articles themselves wholly written by addicts. I have written nothing but my message from the editor. I am completely grateful to all the addict who contributed to it. The cost of the printing was below the projected budget Office Depot initially told me in my bid request, so if necessary or possible, The Bottom Line could be an 8 page publication and be within budget. It is important to note that an 8 page publication would be a more professional folding document, unlike the one you have before you. I am presently gathering material for the next issue, and I have only two pieces. In order for me to publish on schedule, I will need more participation from you, the recovering addicts in this area. I will not personally write the newsletter as a result of poor participation. If necessary, I will hold off publishing fewer issue until I have enough material to fill an issue. I want to thank Toni for all her help with getting it into form for e-mail distribution, and her help with my new budget. The Bottom Line is not going to be available directly from the website as it is not NA approved literature. You can however get on a list being compiled for e-mail distribution. Please send any meeting list changes, anniversaries, announcements, and/or articles to me at [bottomline@goldcoastna.org](mailto:bottomline@goldcoastna.org). If you have any comments, concerns, suggestions for what you might like to see in The Bottom Line please send them to me as well. Anything you would like submitted for publication should be related to recovery in Narcotics Anonymous. Articles should come from members of NA, not family members or friends who are not addicts. The Bottom Line should be written by addicts for addicts, but I repeat, is not NA approved literature, and for that reason I will not take responsibility for the content of articles. Finally, concerning submissions - to avoid my having to edit anything submitted for length, please keep

I am an addict, my name is Toni. Public Information met yesterday at the Peer Center. We had four people present at the meeting. We held our information booth at the Broward County Fair on Friday, November 18. The booth was manned by me, Wade, Ronnie, Katrina, and Cori. Although we did not have many visitors to the booth, it was a successful event. My goal when I ran for the position of PI Chair was to make Narcotics Anonymous a strong presence in the community, in the eyes of the community. We can do that partly by being present at as many local fairs and functions as possible. One of the visitors to our booth was an officer with the Broward Sheriff's Office. He stated that he had been looking for our booth, hoping to find us here. He then thanked us, both for our presence here, and for our work and presence in the community—he said that Narcotics Anonymous and the people in it made his job a lot easier. The South Florida Region PI Committee is planning a Unity Poster Day, probably at some time in the first quarter of 2006. Our PI Committee will participate in this event if at all possible. We discussed dates that would NOT work for us, and I will bring this information to the PI Committee at the RSC next weekend. Hopefully, next month I will report back with a firm date for this event. PI will have an information booth at the Sistrunk Festival, which will take place at Delevoe Park on Saturday, February 18, 2006. We will submit our application this week, and we ask anyone who is interested in helping at the booth to come to the next PI meeting. I received a request for a PI presentation from the director of the psych unit at Broward General. He is in the process of integrating substance abuse treatment into the mental health treatment already offered. In addition to the presentation, he has requested that an H & I meeting be brought into the facility. I have been in contact with Julian, who will attend the presentation if his schedule permits, and who will arrange to add an H & I meeting for this facility to the H & I schedule. I also spoke with the supervisor at the BSO day reporting center in Hollywood, who wanted to discuss a presentation and meeting at his facility. Since this facility is geographically located in the South Broward Area, I contacted Barry, the South Broward PI Chair, and he is now handling the request. I lost my internet access for a couple of weeks this last month, which prevented me from posting minutes and updating the website as soon as I normally would have. I now have a new internet provider and uninterrupted access again, so this should not occur again. The website is up-to-date at this time. I have received absolutely NO emails concerning activities to place on the Gold Coast Activities calendar, so I simply copied all of the Gold Coast Area activities from the Regional Calendar to our activities calendar. If there are any activities that any group or committee would like to see on the calendar, please email me separately. The Region calendar updates only twice a month, while I update ours as I receive information. We collected \$2.00 for the 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition, which we donated to the Peer Center for use of the room for our meeting. Our next PI Committee meeting will be held on Saturday, January 7, 2006, at 2:00 PM at the Peer Center. That is all for PI this month.
