Greetings from H&I. I'm an addict named Julian.

H&I last met on Monday June 5th of 2006. There currently 41 meetings on the roll call and 3 are still completely open.

We held elections for positions in the H&I subcommittee and all positions were filled. We are continuing to take nominations for H&I Chair, currently Terri S. the current Vice-chair is the only member who was nominated for the position and accepted to serve.

I have been truly blessed to be able to serve as H&I chair of the Gold Coast area of Narcotics Anonymous, I am always humbled by the ability to be able to help the sick and suffering addict. H&I is my life. I would be of service to that subcommittee as long as God allows me to take another breath.

There is one thing that I have learned in recovery that I have never forgotten, that is our traditions and concepts. When they are violated it really affects every aspect of the NA structure. We have to remember tradition 6 "that we are trusted servants and we do not govern" it says in concept 4,

“Effective leadership is highly valued in Narcotics Anonymous. Leadership qualities should be carefully considered when selecting trusted servants”. So when we find ourselves in situations which affects the NA service structure and continued disrespect to the body then concepts teach us in concept 10 that we don’t have to bear the front of personalities in NA service” Its only service. It’s that that simple. That every NA member has the right to speak with out fear of prosecution.

If you look at Concept 7 “All members of a service body bear substantial responsibility for that body’s decisions and should be allowed to fully participate in its decision-making processes. “NA service is a team effort. Our service representatives are responsible to the NA Fellowship as a whole rather than any special constituency; so are all the other trusted servants on the team. The full participation of each member of the team is of great value as we seek to express the collective conscience of the whole. We all have the right to participate fully and equally in the decision-making processes in the service bodies in which we are members” When this concept is violated NA suffers tremendously.

When we look at concept 8 “Our service structure depends on the integrity and effectiveness of our communications”. Finally, full and frequent communication is essential in the development of group conscience, the spiritual means by which we invite the influence of a loving God in making our collective decisions. To develop group conscience, communications must be honest and direct. Without the full picture, seen from all sides, our groups, service boards, and committees cannot develop an informed group conscience. When we gather together to consider service issues, we openly share ideas and information with one another, frankly speaking our minds and hearts on the matter at hand. We listen closely to one another, considering carefully the information and insights we’ve heard; we consult our individual consciences on the matter; then, we make a decision. A conscience fed on ignorance is an ineffective conscience, incapable of providing reliable guidance. An effective conscience can develop only in an atmosphere of regular, open communication among all parties concerned.

Concept 9 “All elements of our service structure have the responsibility to carefully consider all viewpoints in their decision-making processes”. It says in this concept that “The expression of the individual conscience to the group is the foundation of group conscience. Without it, we block the guidance of a loving God, our ultimate authority. When a position supported by many of us is challenged by a few of us, our service boards and committees should always treat such input with great respect and careful consideration. The information and insights offered by the few may save us from dangerous mistakes; they may even lead us to new, previously undreamt-of horizons of service, where we might fulfill our fellowship’s primary purpose more effectively than ever. For the sake of our fellowship, and for the sake of our members yet to come, our groups, service boards, and committees must always carefully consider all viewpoints in their decision-making processes.

I feel compelled not to return to this service body due to evidence of last month’s events. At this point Terri my Vice-Chair will be delivering my reports to this body. “This addict has a choice today thank GOD” and we don’t have to be the bear of personalities when we are involved in service. H&I is currently in need of support. We requesting that all GSRs have their groups announce the next H&I subcommittee meeting. H&I meets at the Peer Center, 4545 Powerline Road, the first Monday of the month at 7:15pm. Our next meeting will be on Monday, July 3rd.

I continue to have issues with the printer I am using. Last month, the price of a meeting list went up. This month, I deliberately took the job in earlier than I did last month, with about a week to get it done, to try to avoid any problems. Well, as God would have it, the printer snaffed days before the job was supposed to get done.

When I called on Thursday they told me it would be ready.

Friday, I called and they told me it was all printed, all 3000, but they were neither folded nor stapled. They would be ready Saturday morning.

Saturday morning I called them when they opened at 9:00AM, mind you Kevin needs them at 10:00AM to fill pre-orders. They told me the same thing they told me Friday evening. They would need a couple of hours. I called Kevin and told him that. He said he'd wait for them. **PUBLIC INFORMATION SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT
JUNE, 2006**

Greetings from Public Information. I am an addict, my name is Toni.

Due to circumstances beyond my control, I have been unable to devote much of my recent time to PI activities and responsibilities. I apologize for this, but again, the circumstances were beyond my control.

In April, 2006, the Gold Coast Area Service Committee received a court subpoena for records concerning attendance of a certain individual at NA meetings. The records were to be mailed to the office of the requesting attorney prior to the date specified, or brought to a deposition scheduled for April 17, 2006. I was made aware of this subpoena on Sunday night, April 16, 2006, far too late for us to mail anything. Instead, I appeared at the scheduled deposition as counsel for the Gold Coast Area Service Committee, and produced the letter which follows this report. Thus far, we have had no further contact from the attorney or the Court. Further, since the South Broward Area was also named in the subpoena, I alerted them and provided them with a copy of the subpoena and our response.

Public Information has met informally for the past two months, rather than at the Peer Center, as the schedules of all of the PI Committee members did not permit our regular meeting. As a committee, we set up and manned the Information Table at GCCNA, in conjunction with the PI booth. This was a successful undertaking, which we hope to repeat next year at GCCNA.

I have transmitted our application for a free non-profit booth at this year's Broward County Fair, which will be held from November 16-26, 2006, at the Fort Lauderdale Stadium. I am hoping to have our booth space reserved prior to our next meeting.

PI is submitting a motion today to remove the responsibility for the printed meeting lists from the Newsletter Committee and shift it to the Public Information Committee. We hope you will consider this motion carefully in your home groups. First of all, informing the public—both within and outside of the rooms—about NA is the primary purpose of the Public Information Subcommittee. Where to find us is a crucial piece of that information. The Public Information Subcommittee is already charged with the responsibility for the online meeting list, and should likewise be responsible for the printed version. This would ensure a single point of accountability for all meeting lists.

That is all for PI this month. We hope to have more to report next month.

Dear Mr. Grosz,

This letter is written in response to your subpoena dated March 30, 2006, and served on this organization. The subpoena appears to be directed to Narcotics Anonymous South Broward Area, but then lists the Gold Coast Area Service Committee, and was in fact delivered to the post office box of the Gold Coast Area Service Committee. Let me begin by stating that the South Broward Area of Narcotics Anonymous is not served by the Gold Coast Area Service Committee, but is a completely separate entity.

However, assuming that this subpoena was, in fact, intended for the Gold Coast Area Service Committee, I must inform you that Narcotics Anonymous keeps no membership records and no attendance records, and is in no manner involved in treatment. Therefore, we are unable to comply with your request for records.

Further, the Gold Coast Area Service Committee takes no part in individual Narcotics Anonymous meetings. The service committee exists simply to assist the individual groups in carrying the message of Narcotics Anonymous. Please see the attached page for a brief explanation of Narcotics Anonymous, and feel free to visit the Narcotics Anonymous World Services website at www.na.org for further information.
